### Objectives of the Forum

- Enhanced national governance of the sector
- Better distribution of benefits
- More policy influence by mines ministries
- More international support for capacity building
- More effective and timely government responses to sector challenges
- More positive investment climate



#### The Forum and UNCSD

- Forum is a partnership established at the 2002 World Summit in Johannesburg
- UNCSD periodically reviews progress in advancing Summit priorities (JPOI)
- Mining up for review in 2010-11 cycle (Chemicals, Sust Production and Con, Tran
- (Chemicals, Sust Production and Con, Transport and waste management)
- World Summits and UNCSD lead the multilateral agenda



#### Mining State of Play Circa 2000

- The WB Extractive Industries Review
  - NGOs campaign for WB to get out of EI
- GMI, MMSD, ICMM
  - Industry response to growing sector issues
- The UN system
  - Mining consistently identified as problem in UN documents (e.g. agenda 21)
- Where are national governments in these debates?



### Mining State of Play Circa 2000

- Development needed for poverty alleviation
  - Priority for developing countries
- Development needs to be sustainable
  - Must be competitive
  - Comparative advantage: mineral endowment
  - Need to maximize benefits
- Lessons learned on mining
  - Mining can be sustainable
    - Canada, Australia, Chile, Botswana, etc.
  - If it is done right, i.e. **good governance by national governments**



#### Response by National Governments

#### Why?

- Custodians of the mineral resource
- Managers of the resource
- Elected and mandated by their citizens
- Accountable for the way resources used

#### How

- Input a voice to multi sector gvt views and interests
- Learning and making change together
- Participating actively in policy debates, and showing progress



## The World Summit 2002

#### **Strategy**

- Introduce positive yet balanced mining focused text in the Johannesburg Plan of Implementation (JPOI)
  - Confirm that mining can contribute to SD
  - Raise key issues that need to be addressed
- Develop a Forum for gvts to work together
  - Global Dialogue on mining/metals
    - Reflecting on the best way to work together
    - Decision to establish the Intergovernmental Forum



#### The Intergovernmental Forum

- Inaugurated in 2005
- Nature: voluntary, advisory and consultative
- Objective: promote contribution of MMM to SD
  - Respond to priorities of the mining section of JPOI
- How? By enhancing capacity for governance
  - Sharing lessons learned
  - Identifying opportunities and responding to challenges
  - Providing recommendations on best practices to address issues (social, environmental and economic issues)
  - Working with other regional intergovernmental organizations



#### The Intergovernmental Forum

- Membership: National governments
  - Ministries responsible for mining (50 members)
- Observers
  - Multilateral and international agencies
  - Non-member governments
- National delegations
  - Can include stakeholders: industry, NGOs, etc.
- Canada provides secretariat for first five years
- Chaired by RSA, Canada, UK.
- Sunset clause



# A UNCSD Strategy

- From the Johannesburg World Summit
  - Johannesburg Plan of Implementation: Paragraph 46 on mining/metals
  - Forum is an outcome of the Summit, recognized by ECOSOC; must report
- To the UNCSD Review 2010-11
  - 2010: progress achieved
  - 2011: the way forward
- Set the way forward for whole UN system



### Forum UNCSD objectives

- Enhance influence of governments on global policy development and debates
  - National governments are policy leaders
  - Propose the way forward to the UN system
- Demonstrate the value of the Forum
  - In responding to Para 46 and sector priorities
- Promote active participation by governments
  - Influence is a function of participation



#### Role for Mines Ministries

- Prepare a report on mining for UNCSD national 2010 report
- Have national representative state importance of mining in UNCSD interventions
- Participate in development of the Forum UNCSD policy framework
- Have your national representative express support for framework at UNCSD 2011
- Participate in parallel event on mining/metals



# Role for the Forum

- Work with other intergovernmental organizations, e.g. Africa Mining Partnership, UNECA, CASM, etc.
- Work with other national governments not members of the Forum
- Work with multilateral organizations, e.g. World Bank, UNCTAD, UNDESA
- Work with other stakeholders (eg CASM)
- Intervene at UNCSD
- Arrange UNCSD parallel events



# Policy Framework

- Cover entire sector life cycle
  - Exploration to metals, waste, recycling
- Address all sector issues
  - Economic, social, environmental, health, etc.
- Two components
  - List of policy elements
  - Discussion of individual policy elements
- A Forum / National governments document?



#### Parallel Events at UNCSD

- Events on the margins of the main meeting
- Workshops to document progress or issues
  - Economic, social, environmental, CASM, etc.
  - Life cycle context
  - Lessons learned; case studies, etc.
  - Strategies in place for continuing progress
- All interested stakeholders invited

# National UNCSD report

- An option open to all national governments
- Report on progress achieved since the World Summit
- An opportunity to flag out issues
- The basis for the way forward in 2011
- Set priorities for the multilateral system



# National UNCSD Report

- Proposed objectives
  - Ensure to have a national report on mining for UNCSD 2010
  - Take charge of writing the report
  - Be factual to promote credibility (not campaiging)
  - Work with others to promote consistency and influence



# National UNCSD Report: Action plan (now urgent)

#### Immediate

- Contact Foreign Affairs (?) ministry
- Promote national report on mining for 2010
- Find about national process and timeline
- Offer to lead preparation of the report
- Identify those you should work with
  - Nationally and beyond,
- Collect the required information



# National UNCSD Report: <u>Action Plan</u>

- Make sure ASM in the report
- Follow UNCSD reporting guidelines but go beyond if needed
- Get on national delegation and Lead on drafting mining related national interventions at UNCSD
- Maintain co-ordiantion with the Forum, other intergovernmental groups, etc.



# (2) IGF's UNCSD Policy Framework



### UNCSD Policy Framework

- Objective:
  - Enhance mines ministries influence in global policy development
  - Influence multilateral priorities for mining
  - Enhance support for capacity building in relation to mining good governance



# UNCSD Policy Framework Action plan

- Evaluate how well draft framework reflects national needs and priorities for ASM
- Provide comments to make future drafts more relevant to national ASM needs and priorities
- Discuss evolving drafts at national, regional or other relevant meetings to seek input from other relevant parties

- Objective: Worshops provide opportunity to
  - Showcase case studies on progress done
  - Inform UNCSD delegates on mining
  - Have outcomes included in UNCSD final report
